1971 Elections

For the 1971 elections, the number of constituencies was increased from 12 to 24 with one (1) candidate per constituency elected to the House of Assembly.

On the 16th August, 1971 the Governor General issued a proclamation dissolving Parliament and issued Writs appointing Wednesday 25th August, 1971 as Nomination Day and Thursday 9th September, 1971 as Election Day. The Supervisor of Elections was Dennis A. Smith and the Deputy Supervisor of Elections was Mr. Geoffrey H. Edwards.

One thousand one hundred and forty-two (1,142) Election Officers were deployed at the Polling Stations as follows:




Figure 1: Percentage of votes received by political party (1971)
