5. The Supervisor and Deputy Supervisor of Elections were appointed by the Governor; the Returning Officers, Election Clerks and Presiding Officers by the Cabinet on the recommendation of the Supervisor of Elections; the Poll Clerks and Counting Assistants by the Supervisor of Elections.

Polling Stations

6. Wherever practicable, buildings owned by Government (principally schools) or Local Government Councils were used as polling stations. In addition it was necessary to rent a number of privately owned premises for which rentals of \$15., \$20. and \$30. were paid according to the size of the polling station required.

Administrative Report
by

Sir,

I have the honour to submit my Report on the fourth General Election of members to serve in the House of Assembly since the introduction of adult suffrage and the last before the island became an independent country within the Commonwealth on 30th November, 1966.

Dissolution of the General Assembly and Date of Election

2. The General Assembly was dissolved by His Excellency the Governor on the 10th October, 1966; Nomination day was 18th October, 1966, and the General Election was held on the 3rd November, 1966.

Storage of Election Documents

15. In accordance with the provisions of section 47(1) of the Representation of the People Act, 1957, a total of twenty-nine (29) sealed bags containing election documents forwarded to the Supervisor of Election by the Returning Officers for the respective constituencies were delivered to the Registrar for storage as follows:-

26 bags delivered on 9th November, 1966
3 bags delivered on 2nd December, 1966.

Candidates' Election Expenses

16. Returns of Election expenses were forwarded by fifty-five (55) candidates to the Supervisor of Elections in accordance with the provisions of section 39 of the Representation of the People Act 1957. Fifty-three (53) of these returns were transmitted to the Registrar fourteen (14) days of their receipt and a statement published in the local press as provided under Section 46 of the above mentioned Act.

8. In 80 polling districts where the number of persons on the register exceeded 700, polling stations were divided into two sections. In polling districts MA, WB, WC in the Constituency of St. Michael, and SF in the Constituency of St. James, the number of persons on the Register exceeded 1,500, and it was necessary in these cases to divide the polling stations in three (3) sections. It was necessary to divide polling station YA into four (4) sections. In all cases each section was provided with a presiding officer and poll clerks and the register for the particular district divided equally between each station.

Equipment

9. All equipment for use in the conduct of the election was provided by the Supervisor of Elections, and the Returning Officers and Election Clerks for the several constituencies arranged for their distribution to the polling stations and their collection after polling day.

10. The Ballot boxes and polling booths are at present stored at Glendairy Prison and the Chief Registering Officer's Office at "Verona", Bank Hall, St. Michael.

Publicity

11. Printed forms giving in detail the boundaries of the polling districts within each constituency, and the locations of the polling stations for each district, were posted by the respective Returning Officers at the buildings in which polling stations were established as well as at Police Stations, Local Government buildings, Libraries and such other places as were deemed necessary for the information of the electorate. In addition all newspapers published notices directing attention to the above information.

12. Each polling station was provided with a map showing the district served by that station as well as the boundaries of the adjacent districts with their respective polling stations so that any elector who presented himself at the wrong station might be directed to his correct station.

13. There were a number of reports from persons who claimed to be registered but whose names did not appear on the register. The Permanent Personal system of Registration of Electors was introduced in Barbados during 1966. This system was no readily accepted by the public as it was necessary for each prospective elector to be interviewed by an enumerator before being registered to vote. In spite of the extensive publicity given to the preparation of the new Register during the earlier part of the year and the appeals made by means of Radio, Television and Cinemas, to co-operate with the enumerators in the Registration Programme, many persons refused to apply for registration. However, this lack of interest displayed by the public was soon to be changed as the election campaign was in progress. It was necessary to open (81) eighty-one registration centres throughout the island. In many instances the information given to the enumerators at these centres did not afford adequate allocation to the correct polling district. This contributed mainly to the misallocations and omissions from the Register. In addition many persons did not inspect the electors list with a view of having any errors or omissions corrected during the period allotted for such inspection.

14. Candidates and their election agents were supplied with copies of the forms indicating the location of each polling station within their respective constituencies and giving details of the boundaries of each polling district in order that they might further instruct the electorate in these matters during their political campaigning, either by personal canvassing or by the use of circulars.

General

21. The direction and supervision of, and the procedure at the election were in accordance with the provisions set out in the Representation of the People Act, 1967. Notes for the guidance of election officers were prepared by the Supervisor of Elections and these notes were supplemented by lectures to and discussions with the election officers a number of whom were serving for the first time. The general assistance rendered by the Deputy Supervisor of Elections, Mr. L.H. Clarke and other members of my staff is greatly appreciated.

22. The efficient manner in which the election officers performed their respective duties was largely responsible for the smooth functioning of the election machinery in each constituency and their able and loyal assistance is also sincerely appreciated.

23. I also wish to record my appreciation of the arrangements made by the Commissioner of Police for maintaining order at all polling stations.

24. The general public must also be complimented, their co-operation rendered the whole process of election that much easier; their understanding and discipline contributed in no small measure to the smooth and peaceful conduct of the election.

25. This entire exercise could not have been carried out but for the unstinted co-operation and assistance of all those who in one way or another were required to participate in it. To them all, I wish to record my grateful appreciation.
