REPORT ON THE BYE-ELECTION IN THE CONSTITUENCY OF ST. PETER HELD ON THE 19TH JULY, 1984

In accordance with the provisions of Section 47(2) of the Barbados Constitution, the Governor General on Monday the 25th June, 1984, issued a writ to fill the vacancy in the House of Assembly. The writ appointed the 4th July, 1984, as Nomination Day and 19th July, 1984 as Polling Day. The Governor General, in accordance with the provisions of Section 18(1) of the Representation of the People Act, Cap.12, having issued the writ on the 25th June, 1984, declared the period ending 14th July, 1984, as the special electoral registration period.

Appointment of Certain Election Officers Idua and to eradment vd

- 2. In accordance with the provisions of Sections
 30(2), 31 and 32(1) of the Representation of the People Act,
 Cap.12 the following appointments were made:
 - (1) Mr. Simeon Earle Deputy Supervisor of Elections
 - (2) Mr. Peter Timothy Returning Officer
 - (3) Mr. A. Keith Estwick Election Clerk
- 3. In addition to the officers mentioned above, other appointments were made in accordance with sub-sections (1) and (2) of Section 33 of the Act. A complete list of such officers is set out as Appendix "A".

4. Notice of election was published in the Extra
Ordinary Gazette (No. 57), the Nation and the Barbados
Advocate Newspapers on the 26th June, 1984, in accordance
with the provisions of Rule 3 of the Rules for Conduct of
House of Assembly Elections.

Publication of the Revised Register of Electors and Register for Elections

- 5. The Revised Register of Electors was published on the 27th June, 1984, in accordance with the provisions of Section 18(1) (b) of the Representation of the People Act, Cap.12 and consisted of 7 475 persons.
- Registration of Electors Regulations (Cap.12) the Revising Centre was established at the St. Peter's Girls' School from the 27th June to 9th July, 1984. In accordance with Regulation 35A of the Regulations, the last date for the receipt of claims was fixed as 3rd July, while 9th July, 1984 was fixed as the last date for the receipt of objections.
- 7. Lists setting out the names of persons who filed claims were prepared daily and made available for inspection by members of the public. Similarly, lists of objections were also prepared for public inspection.
- 8. The Register for Elections was published on the 1984-07-14 and comprised 7 613 voters.

- 9. Nomination Papers were handed in to the Returning Officer, Mr. Peter Timothy at the St. Peter Girls' School. The following five (5) candidates were duly nominated to Contest the election:
 - (1) Mr. Owen S. Arthur of 31 Oxnards Road, St. James;
 - (2) Mr. Martin P. Cadogan of Farm Road, St. Peter;
 - (3) Mr. Everton Green of Farm Road, St. Peter;
 - (4) Mrs. Sybil F.P. Leacock of The Whim, St. Peter;
 - (5) Mr. Glenroy E.S. Straughn of Gills Road, Bridgetown, St. Michael.

Statements of persons nominated to contest the election as well as guides setting out the locations of the Polling Stations were publicly displayed by the Returning Officer at the Nomination Centre and at all buildings selected as Polling Stations within the Constituency.

Polling Stations

10. There were eleven (11) buildings used as Polling Stations at the election of which three (3) were privately owned. Rent ranged from \$200.00 to \$250.00. In accordance with the provisions of Rule 12(2) of the House of Assembly Rules, polling began at 6.00 a.m. and ended at 6.00 p.m.

Election Circulars

11. The Supervisor of Elections, in an effort to ensure that electors in the Constituency were fully aware of the locations of their respective Polling Stations, arranged for a computerized circular to be issued to each elector providing the necessary information. Unfortunately, an error in a computer programme caused conflicting information to be produced in the circular, which was of great concern. However, new circulars were prepared and delivered on the 1984-07-18.

12. The counting of the votes took place at the Alexandra School. The count began at approximately 8.30 p.m. on the 19th July and ended at 1.30 a.m. on the 20th July, 1984. At the conclusion of the count, two of the candidates received equal number of votes and a recount was requested by one of the Election Agents. The Returning Officer consented to a recount and it was agreed that 4.00 p.m. on the 20th July, 1984 would be acceptable to all to begin the recount. This recount lasted approximately eighteen (18) hours and ended with Mrs. Sybil Leacock gaining a majority of one (1) vote over Mr. Owen S. Arthur. A second recount was requested but this was refused by the Returning Officer.

Storage of Election Documents

- 13. At the conclusion of the first count, the Ballot Boxes were re-sealed and stored at the Holetown Police Station.
- 14. After the recount of the votes, the Ballot Boxes along with the Counted Ballot Papers remained at the Alexandra School under Police Supervision until Monday 23rd July, 1984 when the election documents were delivered to the Registrar in accordance with Rule 56(2) of the House of Assembly Election Rules.

- 15. Returns of election expenses were filed by the Candidates/Election Agents in accordance with the provisions of Section 52(1) of the Act. These returns have been delivered to the Registrar in accordance with the provisions of Section 60(2) of the Act. Each candidate was allowed to incur expenses up to a maximum of \$7 613 in accordance with the provisions of Section 48(2) of the Act.

Mrs. Sybil Leacock was named as first respondent and Mr. Peter Timothy as second respondent. The Court ruled that errors by the election officials affected the result of the election and as such declared the election null and void.

Return of the Writ

20. The return of the writ was fixed for 20th July, 1984, but the count was not completed and as such the writ was returned on the 21st July, 1984.

General

21. The election was conducted in accordance with the provisions of the Act. The Returning Officer in his report on discipline at the Counting of Votes commented as follows:-

"Very unsatisfactory".

Unfortunately too many persons were permitted in the Counting Centre and this was primarily responsible for the disorder which resulted.
