## REPORT ON THE 1985 BY-ELECTION IN THE CONSTITUENCY OF ST. THOMAS

#### Introduction

In accordance with the provisions of Section 47(2) of the Barbados Constitution, the Governor General issued a Writ on Monday 29th April, 1985, to fill the vacancy in the House of Assembly caused by the death of Rt. Hon. J.M.G.M. Adams, Prime Minister. The Writ appointed the 8th and 23rd May, 1985, as Nomination Day and Polling Day respectively. The 25th May, 1985, was appointed as the day by which the Writ was returnable to the Governor General.

2. This Election was the first to be supervised by the Electoral and Boundaries Commission appointed under the Barbados Constitution (Amendment) Act, 1981-24 which came into effect by proclamation on the 1st April, 1985.

#### Election Officers

- 3. In accordance with the provisions of Sections
  30(2), 31 and 32(1) of the Representation of the People Act
  Cap. 12, the following appointments were made -
  - (1) Mr. Simeon Earle Deputy Supervisor of Elections.
  - (2) Mr. Alfred Trotman Returning Officer.
  - (3) Mr. A. Keith Estwick Election Clerk.
- 4. Other appointments were also made in accordance with Section 33(1) and (2). A complete list has been attached as Appendix "A".

#### Notice of Election

5. The Notice of Election was published in the Barbados Advocate and Nation Newspapers on the 30th April, 1985, and the Official Gazette on the 29th April, 1985, in accordance with the provisions of Rule 3 of the House of Assembly Election Rules.

# Nomination Day proceedings TOMIN 1985 AFT NO TROPER

- 6. Nomination papers were deposited with the Returning Officer, Mr. Alfred Trotman at the Holy Innocents School. The following two candidates were nominated to contest the election -
  - (1) Mr. Ronald J. Rock of Rock Hall, St. Thomas, and
    - (2) Mr. David A.C. Simmons of 19 Neils,
      St. Michael, an Attorney-At-Law.
- 7. Mr. Rock appointed Mr. Warwick Franklin of Oughtlands, St. Philip, as his election agent while Mr. Simmons appointed Mr. Peter Scott of Farmers, St. Thomas.

## Publication of the Revised Register of Electors and Register for Elections

- 8. The Revised Register of Electors was published on the 31st May, 1985, in accordance with the provisions of Section 18(1) (b) of the Representation of the People Act Cap. 12 and comprised 7 503 electors. The following revising centres were established in accordance with the provisions of Regulation 35(3) of the Registration of Electors Regulations Cap. 12 -
  - (1) Holy Innocents Mixed School
  - (2) Community Centre Rock Hall
  - (3) Welches Mixed School.
- 9. In accordance with Regulation 35A of the Regulations, the last date for the receipt of claims was fixed as 8th May, while 13th May, 1985, was fixed as the last date for the receipt of objections.

5. The Notice of Election was published in the Barback Advocate and Nation Newspapers on the 30th April, 1985, and the Official Gazette on the 29th April, 1985, in accordance with the provisions of Rule 3 of the House of Assembly

- 10. Lists setting out the names of persons who filed claims were prepared daily and made available for inspection by members of the public. Objections filed were also made available for public inspection. There were two hundred and sixteen (216) objections filed, of which one hundred and eighteen (118) were successful. Many of those unsuccessful were attributed to inadequate information submitted by the objectors.
- 11. The Register of Electors was published on the 19th May, 1985, and comprised seven thousand, six hundred and eighteen (7 (18) electors.

- 13. In an effort to ensure that all electors within the constituency were fully aware of the locations of their respective polling stations, a computerised circular was sent to each elector providing the necessary information.
- 14. In However four hundred and ninety-three (493) of the saw seven thousand, six hundred and eighteen (7 618) issued were seturned to the Electoral Office by the postal authorities as undelivered. Defailed as expected to require the setup of the postal authorities as undelivered.

#### Polling Day proceedings

- 15. In accordance with the provisions of Rule 12(2) of the House of Assembly Rules, polling began at 6.00 a.m. and ended at 6.00 p.m.
- 16. In general, polling was orderly. There was some fustration by voters who had to wait for sometime to cast their ballots at the polling stations located in the Community Centre building at Rock Hall. This situation arose as a result of unsatisfactory seating arrangements by the election officials at these stations. The Presiding Officers were seated too far away from the Poll Clerks at the entrance and as such the names of voters had to be repeated on numerous occasions.
- 17. In addition residents of the Gordon Cummins Hospital had to be assisted by the Presiding Officers in casting their votes and this also contributed to the problems at these stations.
- 18. The Police as usual were responsible for the transportation of the Ballot Boxes from the polling stations to the Counting Centre at Holy Innocents School. Unfortunately, all of the boxes did not arrive at the Counting Centre before the scheduled start of the count, thereby causing a delay in the commencement. It was revealed subsequently that some of the vehicles had to make more than one journey.

- 19. The Returning Officer had selected the older section of the school as the location where the votes would have been counted, but this was rejected as unsuitable since the new wing provided far better accommodation for all involved in the process, including the media.
- 20. The counting of the votes commenced at 8.35 p.m. just over half an hour late and ended at 12.40 a.m. on 24th May, 1985. Mr. David Simmons of the Barbados Labour Party was the successful candidate with 3 036 votes while the other candidate Mr. Ronald Rock of the Democratic Labour Party polled 2 533 votes. There were 36 rejected ballot papers.

### Storage of Election Documents

21. The documents have been stored with the Registrar in accordance with the provisions of Rule 56(2) of the House of Assembly Rules.

#### Returns of Election Expenses

- 22. The returns of Election Expenses were filed within the statutory period set out by Section 52(1) of the Act. These returns have been delivered to the Registrar in accordance with the provisions of Section 60(2) of the Act. Each candidate was allowed to incur expenses up to a maximum of \$7 618 in accordance with the provisions of Section 48(2) of the Act.

26. Mr. Alfred Trotman Returning Officer submitted claims totalling \$1 100 for the erection of booths, transportation of chairs and cleaning shools all in connection with the election. These were however rejected as no bills or statements were presented to support the claims.

#### General

- 27. The comments made by the Returning Officer at paragraphs 13 to 16 are as follows:-

- 15. Observations as to the state of the election papers as received from the Presiding Officers. Satisfactory.
- 16. General Remarks:

The Presiding Officers reported that they experienced no problems during the course of the day. In my opinion, the whole exercise was well executed."

#### Complaint against the Police

- 28. The Commissioner of Police was notified of the shabby treatment meted out by members of the Police to the Chairman and another member of the Commission when they attended the Counting Centre at Holy Innocents' School, although their vehicles bore special stickers agreed upon by the Police.
- 29. An apology was extended to the Commission and assurance given that there will not be a recurrence.

#### Adverse reports on Mr. Trotman

- 30. A candidate at the election registered complaints with the Commission relating to the conduct of Mr. Trotman Returning Officer for the Constituency.
- 31. Investigations carried out exonerated Mr. Trotman on all charges except one in which he was entirely to be blamed.
