CONSTITUTIONAL PROVISIONS FOR THE REVIEW OF CONSTITUENCY BOUNDARIES

2. Section 41D (1) of the Constitution states as follows:

"The Commission shall, in accordance with this section, review the number and boundaries of the constituencies into which Barbados is divided and submit to the Minister for presentation to each House in accordance with this section reports either

- (a) Showing the constituencies into which it recommends

 Barbados should be divided in order to give effect to the rules
 set out in the Third Schedule; or
- (b) stating that, in the opinion of the Commission, no alteration is required to

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the existing number or boundaries of constituencies in order to give effect to the rules referred to in paragraph (a)."

The Rules referred to are set out in the Third Schedule to the Constitution which states as follows:-

"The electorate shall, so far as practicable be equal in all constituencies:

Provided that the electorate in any constituency shall, so far as practicable, not exceed 110% nor be less than 90% of the total electorate divided by the number of constituencies therein.

- 3. Natural boundaries such as highways and rivers shall be used wherever possible."
- 3. Section 41D (2) of the Constitution states as follows:
 "Reports under subsection (1) shall be submitted by the Commission
 - (a) in the case of its first report, not less than one or more than five years from the date of appointment of members of the Commission;
 - (b) in the case of any subsequent report, not less than two or more than five years from the date of the submission of its last report".

5. As at the date of the Second Report of the Commission on the 25 November, 1994, when the formula set out in the Third Schedule to the Constitution was applied, the number of electors in four (4) constituencies were below the permitted range and the number of electors in three (3) constituencies were above the permitted range. In the circumstances the Commission concluded that it was necessary for there to be an enumeration of electors to be undertaken urgently before a conclusion could be arrived at on the necessity to review boundaries. The Commission also expressed the opinion that no alteration was then required to the existing number or boundaries of constituencies since it would have been unwise to proceed with a review of boundaries on inadequate or inaccurate information.

ENUMERATION PROGRAMME

- 6. The Commission implemented the recommendation of the previous Commission that an enumeration of electors be undertaken.
- 7. An enumeration programme designed to update the electoral register commenced on 18 March, 1996.
- 8. At the conclusion of the survey in June 1996 thirty-two thousand, one hundred and eighty-seven (32 187) persons could not be located by the enumerators.
- 9. Before steps were taken by the Commission to delete from the Register of Electors those persons who could not be located, the Commission, in addition to sending circulars to those electors, by letter dated 12 February, 1997 provided a statistical analysis to, and advised the major political parties of the findings of the Commission.

- 10. In order to enable the Commission to validly delete certain persons from the Register of Electors an amendment was made to the Representation of the People Act Cap. 12 requiring the Commission to publish certain notices in the Official Gazette and daily newspapers.
- 11. Notices containing a list of the names of twenty-eight thousand, one hundred and thirty-five (28 135) electors were published in accordance with the amendment to the Representation of the People Act giving 22 January, 1998 as the deadline to contact the Chief Electoral Officer.
 - 12. As at the 22 January, 1998, five thousand, nine hundred and ninety-seven (5 997) persons were located and twenty-two thousand, one hundred and thirty-eight persons were accordingly deleted from the Register of Electors after due compliance with the relevant legislative enactment.

REGISTER OF ELECTORS

- 13. The Register of Electors published on the 31 January, 1998 contained the names of one hundred and ninety-four thousand, nine hundred and ninety-nine (194 999) electors.
- 14. Revisions have since been made to the Register of Electors and as at the 28 July, 1998 the electorate comprised of two hundred thousand, two hundred and fifty (200 250) persons set out in Table 1. That Register as represented by the figures at Table 1 constituted the basis of the Commission's deliberations.

CONFORMITY OF CONSTITUENCIES WITH THE RULES IN THE THIRD SCHEDULE TO THE CONSTITUTION

15. When the formula as set out in the Third Schedule to the Constitution is applied to Table 1 for determining the maximum and minimum number of electors per constituency there would be a maximum range of seven thousand, eight hundred and sixty-seven (7 867) and a minimum range of six thousand, four hundred and thirty-seven (6 437) electors per constituency, based on an average of seven thousand, one hundred and fifty-two (7 152) per constituency. Fifteen (15) constituencies are within the range, eight (8) constituencies are below and five above the range. An analysis is set out in Table 2.

- 16. Since the last Commission's report population movement has produced the result that, the number of registered voters in the City of Bridgetown and the St. Michael constituencies has declined. Accordingly, these constituencies now account for sixty-nine thousand, one hundred and twenty-three (69 123) registered voters compared with seventy-five thousand, two hundred and thirty-two (75 232) voters in 1994. Further in 1998 not only are there seven (7) constituencies in St. Michael below the range compared with four (4) in 1994 but in addition there are now five (5) constituencies above the range compared with three (3) in 1994. The Commission also noted the variation in the present average population distribution per constituency in the St. Michael (6 300), Christ Church (7 600) and St. Philip (8 700) while St. James South has a voter registration of nine thousand, one hundred and five (9 105) voters.
- 17. In reaching its recommendations and applying the present constitutional provision the Commission noted the significant population shift from St. Michael to St. James and St. Philip as reflected in the data. The Commission gave due consideration to all of the above factors and examined all of the options available to it including:
 - (a) the removal of a St. Michael constituency;
 - (b) the addition of another constituency in St. Philip or St. James;
 - (c) making no changes to the existing constituencies as presently constituted.

CONSULTATION

18. Proposals for the review of the constituency boundaries were sent to the National Democratic Party which did not make any recommendations for changes to constituencies but expressed the view that numbers could never be the sole

criterion to be used in the determination of equality of constituencies and suggested that the fundamental requirement was a change in the Constitution to protect the integrity of the parish system to which people relate politically, socially and in economic terms and the introduction of local government.

RECOMMENDATIONS

- 19. The majority of the Commission noted the disparity in the spread of the electorate between St. Michael, St. James South, Christ Church and St. Philip and was satisfied that without a radical restructuring of all constituencies it was reasonably possible on this occasion to realign constituency boundaries to accommodate the present spread of population.
- 20. The minority view was that no changes to boundaries should at this time be recommended since they considered that such changes as are necessary should be made within two years of the previous election without partisanship and should reflect -
 - (1) parish boundaries as far as practicable;
 - (2) the integrity of communities as a whole;
 - (3) consideration of size, topography as well as population of the constituency.
- 21. The Commission by a majority vote, accepted a proposal for the alterations to the boundaries to certain constituencies and recommends that Barbados be divided into twenty-eight constituencies as specified in paragraph 22. The boundaries to these constituencies are shown as Appendix 1 to this report and on the two (2) maps at Appendix 2 and 3 respectively.
