REPORT ON THE BY-ELECTION IN THE CONSTITUENCY OF ST.THOMAS HELD ON 21,SEPTEMBER, 2001

Issue of Writ

- 1. In accordance with the provisions of Section 47 (2) of the Constitution of Barbados, the Governor General on Wednesday, 29th, August 2001 issued a Writ to fill the vacancy in the House of Assembly caused by the resignation of Mr. David Anthony Cathcart Simmons, Member of Parliament for the constituency of St. Thomas. The Writ appointed Thursday, 6th September 2001 and Friday, 21st, September 2001 as Nomination Day and Polling Day, respectively.
- 2. The Governor General in accordance with the provision of Section 18(1) of the Representation of the People Act, Cap.12 ("The Act") declared the period ending Monday, 17th, September 2001 as the Special Electoral Registration Period.

Appointment of Election Officials

3. Mrs. Brenda A. Corbin acting Deputy Chief Electoral Officer was appointed Deputy Supervisor of Elections. Mr.Halcourt Bovell and Mr. Samuel Whitfield Brathwaite were appointed Returning Officer and Election Clerk respectively. A complete list of other election officials is set out at Appendix A.

Notice of Election

4. The Notice of Election was published in the Official Gazette of 29th August 2001 and the Nation and Barbados Advocate Newspapers on 30th August 2001 in accordance with the provisions of Rule 2 of the House of Assembly Election Rules.

Publication of the Revised Register of Electors and Register for Elections

- 5. In accordance with the provisions of Section 18 (1) (b) of the Representation of the People Act Cap.12, the revised register of electors also known as the Preliminary List of Electors was published on Thursday, 30thAugust, 2001 and comprised eight thousand three and five (8305) electors.
- 6. The Revising Centres established under Regulation 35 (3) of the Representation of the People (Registration of Electors) Regulations 1990 were located as follows: -

HOLY INNOCENTS PRIMARY SCHOOL

SHARON PRIMARY SCHOOL

WELCHES PRIMARY SCHOOL

The Centres were opened to the public from Friday, 31stAugust 2001 to Friday, 07th September 2001.

- 7. In accordance with Regulation 35A of the Representation of the People (Registration of Electors) Regulations 1990 the last date for the receipt of claims was fixed as Wednesday 05 September, 2001 while Friday 07 September 2001 was fixed as the last date for the receipt of objections.
- 8. Lists setting out the names of persons who filed claims were prepared daily and made available for inspection by members of the public. A total of two hundred and ninety eight (298) Claims were entered in the appropriate Register for the Constituency of St. Thomas.
- 9. A total of two (2) Objections were filed. Both were disallowed on the basis that insufficient information was supplied to facilitate proper investigation.
- 10. The Register for Elections was published on 17th September 2001 and comprised eight thousand five hundred and twenty eight (8528) electors.

Nomination Day

- 11. The following two (2) candidates were duly nominated to contest the election:
 - i. Ms. Cynthia Yvonne Forde159 Cane GardenSt.Thomas
 - ii. Mr. George Andrew Pilgrim Spring Farm St.Thomas

Ms. Forde appointed Mr. Caswell Franklyn of Rock Hall, St. Thomas as her Election Agent.

Mr. Pilgrim appointed Mr. Haynesly Benn of Welches, St. Thomas as his Election Agent.

Election Circulars

In an effort to ensure that all electors within the Constituency were fully aware of the location of their respective polling stations, a computerized circular was sent to each elector providing the necessary information.

Voting by Election Officers

14. Elections Officers were given the opportunity to cast their ballot in advance of Election Day; in accordance with Rule 30 of the House of Assembly Elections Rules contained in the Representation of the People Act.

A Special Presiding Officer, appointed by the Commission to supervise the voting was provided with the required material and documentation to complete the assignment.

The poll of Election Officers was taken on Tuesday 18th September 2001 between 7.00 a.m. and 5.00 p.m. at the Vestry- Sharon Moravian Church.

Polling Day Proceedings

- 15. In accordance with the provisions of Rule 12 (2) of the House of Assembly Election Rules, polling began at 6.00 a.m. and ended at 6.00 p.m.
- 16. Polling was orderly throughout the day.
- 17. After the close of the poll buses from the Transport Board were used to provide transportation for the Election Officers from the Polling Stations to the Counting Centre. That system proved efficient and all the ballot boxes arrived at the Counting Centre in good time.

18. The counting of the votes began at 8.00 p.m on 21st September 2001 and ended at 11.45 p.m on the same day, when the results of the Poll were announced. The results of the Poll were as follows: -

Ms. Cynthia Yvonne Forde of the Barbados Labour Party received three thousand six hundred and sixty-two (3,662) votes, while Mr. George Andrew Pilgrim of the Democratic Labour Party polled one thousand seven hundred and forty (1,740) votes. There were thirty-two (32) rejected ballot papers.

Ms. Cynthia Yvonne Forde was declared and duly certified to be the member elected to serve in the House of Assembly for the Constituency of St.Thomas.

Storage of Election Documents

19. The documents have been stored with the Registrar in accordance with the provisions of the Rule 56 (2) of the House of Assembly Election Rules.

Return of Election Expenses

- 20. The returns of Election Expenses were filed within the statutory period set out in Section 52 (1) of the Act. Each candidate was allowed to incur expenses up to a maximum of \$85,280.00 in accordance with the provisions of Section 48 (2) of the Act and the amounts expended were within the prescribed limits.
- 21. The following is a summary of the candidates' election expenses: -
